What is this medicine?

Semaglutide is a glucagon-like peptide-1 (GLP-1) receptor agonist that helps regulate blood sugar levels, promotes satiety, and aids in weight loss, while Tirzepatide is a dual GLP-1 and glucose-dependent insulinotropic polypeptide (GIP) receptor agonist that enhances blood sugar control and promotes weight loss by mimicking the effects of incretin hormones.



What is it used for?

Injectable Semaglutide and Tirzepatide can both aid in treating obesity and chronic weight management when combined with a reduced-calorie diet and increased physical activity. These medications are also effective for managing type 2 diabetes and may offer cardiovascular benefits, with Semaglutide potentially reducing cardiovascular mortality and events, and Tirzepatide providing additional cardiovascular benefits for patients with established cardiovascular disease.



What is the most common side effect I can expect?

Nausea is the most common side effect of both injectable Semaglutide and Tirzepatide. To help limit nausea, it's recommended to eat bland, low-fat foods such as crackers, toast, and rice, which are gentle on the stomach. Incorporating foods with high water content, like soups, can also be beneficial. Additionally, avoid lying down immediately after eating to prevent discomfort. Eating slowly and taking the time to chew food thoroughly can aid in digestion and reduce the likelihood of nausea. After meals, stepping outdoors for some fresh air can further help alleviate any feelings of nausea. Staying hydrated and sipping on clear fluids throughout the day can also support overall comfort. How does it work?

Semaglutide and Tirzepatide aid in weight loss by slowing down stomach emptying and signaling to the brain that the stomach is full. This helps patients feel less hungry and satisfied with fewer calories, promoting effective weight management.



What should I monitor?

How should I use this medication?

Administer the prescribed dose via subcutaneous injection, typically once a week. Ensure to rotate the injection site each week to prevent irritation. Follow your healthcare provider's instructions on the correct injection technique. Avoid eating or drinking for at least 30 minutes before and after the injection for optimal absorption and efficacy.



How do I store Injectable Semaglutide or Tirzepatide?

Store injectable Semaglutide and Tirzepatide in the refrigerator at a temperature between 36°F and 46°F (2°C to 8°C). Keep the medications in their original packaging to protect them from light. Do not freeze, and avoid storing them in the freezer compartment. If needed, these medications can be kept at room temperature, up to 86°F (30°C), for a maximum of 30 days. Always check the expiration date and do not use the medication if it has passed. Keep out of reach of children and pets.
