



General Pet Transdermal Gel (Dog)

Note: Your veterinarian has prescribed this medication in a transdermal gel. This form allows the medication to be absorbed into the bloodstream through the skin of the dog's ear, under the stomach, where the legs connect to the body or on a patch of fur that has been shaved. Please follow the directions below. If you have any questions, please contact your pharmacy.

Directions:

1. Wear gloves when applying transdermal gel.
2. Push the prescribed amount of medication out of the applicator onto your gloved fingers.
3. Rub in the medication into the front of your dog's ear where there is the least amount of fur OR on the stomach in an area with little fur OR where the legs meet the body if there is little to no fur OR in the shaved area of your dog.
4. Rub in the gel well, remove gloves and wash your hands.
5. There may or may not be a thin film of powder left after the gel dries. This depends on the medication prescribed. If there is a film, it may be wiped off with a wet paper towel before the next application.
6. Store medication at room temperature.
