



Nitroglycerin Ointment

Common Use: This is a topical ointment often used for anal fissures. When used for this purpose, it is prepared in several strengths from 0.2% to 0.5%. It is usually applied two to four times daily.

Directions:

Wash hands before and after use. When applying the medication, be sure to use a finger cot, glove or a Q-Tip® and apply into anal canal. This insures that the medication is being absorbed only where needed.

Precautions: Apply medication exactly as directed by your physician. Do not use differently without your physician's authorization.
